



## EU police mission for the Palestinian territories get new Head of Mission

## “EUPOL COPPS attends seminar on "Transformation for Justice"”

EUPOL COPPS attended the International Stakeholder Seminar "Transformation for Justice" in Ramallah organized by the employees of the Ministry of Justice in the presence of H.E. the Prime Minister Dr. Rami Al-Hamdallah. Five teams presented their achievements in the past three years to international organizations active in the Justice Sector. The Ministry of Justice transformation process, set up by British experts Social Pioneers and funded by the British Consulate General has been fully supported by EUPOL COPPS mission in Ramallah.



## EUPOL COPPS delivers training equipment for Palestinian Police

EUPOL COPPS delivered specific equipment for Crime Scene Investigation (CSI) training at the Palestinian College for Police Sciences (PCPS) in Jericho. This equipment was included originally for the In-Service Training Project, together with 44 mattresses, 22 blue knives and 22 blue guns recently delivered. The In-Service Training will start on 3 March in the Pilot District (Salfit). It will consist of a training curriculum meant to refresh and reinforce Basic Police Skills such as stopping a vehicle by applying gradual use of force and preserving a crime scene.



## EUPOL COPPS delivers training on surveillance for Palestinian Civil Police

EUPOL COPPS delivered a 4-day training course on surveillance to the Anti-Narcotics Administration (ANA). The training course took place in Ramallah and aimed at further enhancing the skills of 11 ANA police officers on surveillance drill in the field. The training course consisted of lectures in class rooms and tactical exercises in real condition. The objective of this training is to foster the capabilities of ANA undercover officers to collect evidences in the field in order to be used on court.



## Handover drug tests to PCP Antinarcotics Department

EUPOL COPPS handed over several drug test kits to the Palestinian Civil Police Anti-Narcotics Department, represented by Lieutenant Colonel Abdullah Ilawie – Deputy Director of Anti-Narcotics Department. This department is the key player in the West Bank to deal with drug offences. One of the main preconditions to fulfill this task for the ANA police officers is the necessity to have a proper identification of different types of drugs. To further enhance the capability of this department in conducting its missions, EUPOL COPPS delivered more than 500 drug detection kits.
