



PCP instructors complete course on Curriculum Development

EUPOL COPPS' Police Advisory Training Team attended the closing ceremony of a 3-week Curriculum Development course provided by the Central Training Administration (CTA) to 9 PCP trainers of the College of Palestine for Police Sciences (CPPS). The implementation of this *Training of Trainers (ToT)* supports the Ministry of Interior's belief that all training curriculum delivered to the Palestinian Security Forces should be developed according to a standardized format approved by the Ministry.



PCP finishes 2-day seminar Community Oriented Police

Thirty-five PCP officers completed a 2-day seminar on Community Oriented Police that was implemented in Ramallah by Police advisers from Jordan and Sweden, and coordinated and funded by EUPOL COPPS. This seminar was organized after the Mission's Community Policing experts met with the Community Police Department of the Middle Amman Police Directorate.



New Number for Family Protection Units on International Women Day

To mark the 100th International Women's Day on 8th March, EUPOL COPPS supported the PCP's creation of a unique and direct phone number for the PCP's Family Protection Units, which citizens, especially women, can call when they are in need of help. Female and other victims of violence in the West Bank will now be able to access assistance from Family Protection Units staff directly on the phone rather than going through a previous screening of calls in PCP operations rooms.



Palestinian Bar Association issues updated Lawyers' Directory

The Palestinian Bar Association (PBA) and EUPOL COPPS' Rule of Law Section announced the publication of an updated version of the Palestinian Lawyers' Directory. This joint effort will facilitate citizens' access to justice and enhance good communication between them and the PBA. 3,500 copies of this updated Lawyers Directory are currently being distributed in the OPT.



First economic crime training for Palestinian Civil Police

EUPOL COPPS' Prosecution expert and Criminal Investigation Department adviser jointly delivered their first training course in economic crime to the PCP's Economics Crimes Unit at the Mission's Headquarters in Ramallah. This specialized training was designed at the request of the PCP's Economic Crimes Unit, with the aim of achieving concrete synergies between investigators and prosecutors. The training focused on Police-Prosecution cooperation during economic crime investigation, particularly in the gathering of evidence, the tracing of assets, and the confiscation and recovery of assets from abroad with the help of practical examples
