Busy and eventful summer for EUPOL COPPS!

The Mission carried on its open and comprehensive dialogue on Rule of Law standards related to the right to peaceful assembly, with both NGOs (Al-Haq, Musawa, etc.) and Palestinian institutions of the security and justice sectors.



Following the tragic death of Nizar Banat, many demonstrations were organized and key questions were raised regarding the conditions to set up a public demonstration as well as the best modus operandi to handle these demonstrations from a security point of view. In cooperation with EUREP, EUPOL COPPS provided its technical expertise in order to dispel

misperceptions and find a common ground to ensure that the right to peaceful assembly is respected and protected by the Palestinian institutions. The restoration of a free but peaceful political debate is of great interest for all interested actors as well as a convincing marker of state-building.

On another front, the Mission and the PCP launched the media campaign designed to inform about the cybercrime of blackmailing. I am very happy to see that it had a great echo in the Palestinian media.
